The Argument Behind Full Statehood

What is the need for full statehood?

DDA, Police and MCD need to be fully under the Delhi government.

- 1. DDA for land and housing issues. How can the Delhi government ensure efficient and effective land usage and allocation for its people and welfare programs if it has no say in it?
- 2. Police for fixing accountability for Delhi's law and order. The issue to make the Delhi Police is that it is currently not responsive or accountable to the people of Delhi. Every political party wants complete control over the state police and yet they keep saying that they will make Delhi a full state when elections are near. The Central Government can grant this wish of the people of Delhi, and yet both the BJP and Congress have been unsuccessful in doing so.
- MCD: As a local body which is supposed to work on health, education and sanitation, the synchronization in utilization of resources is extremely poor. The BJP-run MCD is also terribly planned, extremely corrupt and fiscally imprudent.

For example, during interactions with traders, a couple of issues constantly emerge: the harassment that they have to face by the DDA due to its unreasonable policies on conversion charges and by the MCD due to its threats to carry out ceiling drives and business closures. In both the issues Delhi government can't do much except use its immense political capital to mount pressure.

Is the demand for full statehood pragmatic?

It is certainly a pragmatic demand, and one that at least on paper is shared by the NDA at the center. If they too felt it was a foolish unrealistic promise, why would they have it in their manifesto? In fact, whenever BJP has been in opposition, full statehood of Delhi has been a major issue, which they have raised at every opportunity.

Just because of the central government and diplomatic presence in Delhi-a city-state of 20 million people must suffer having no control over their police and land use and development? AAP does not believe so.

Can embassies come under state-controlled areas?

Embassy areas and central government are in the NDMC zone of the city. A central run police force can easily be both provided for and budgeted for separately-while allowing the

rest of Delhi Police and as importantly the DDA to come under the Delhi State Government. This is not even unheard of; as an example the Vatican exists as a separate state with a separate police force within the city limits of Rome.

In many US cities, education universities run a police department of their own which is separate from the city police department. These university police departments are able to offer higher quality services, such as faster response times, frequent patrolling, in their jurisdiction than what the city police will be able to deliver. They have the same powers in their jurisdiction as the city police. A similar modality can be worked out in this case as well.

Many other countries have the capital city under the central government, think of Australia, US and Canada?

Most developed countries that you mention like USA, Australia and Canada have very small administrative capitals made for that purpose: like Washington DC, Canberra and Ottawa. They are not the big population centers of the world and are made only for governance and thus in the hands of the federal government. We have to compare ourselves to countries, which are big population centers and face big intractable problems of health, education, sanitation, security and transport. You will find that such capital cities have all administrative powers given to them to prevent policy paralysis! Even New York City, where a huge number of embassies and even the United Nations exist has local police in the NYPD and is run by a mayor. Similarly, even London has its local Police Department but has Scotland Yard for more serious investigation. Streamlining and clear delineation of responsibility is required. Yes, protection of Parliament has to be under the Central government but will the Central government take responsibility and accountability for case of sexual harassment in Burari, a robbery in Kirari or theft in Vasant Kunj? Aren't local issues of safety and security better tackled at the local level?

BJP's volte-face on full statehood for Delhi



The Bill proposed that the Centre would control public order and police for the entire city, but would have a say on the subjects of land and local government only for the New Delhi area.

The draft was prepared in June 1998 under the chief ministership of Sahib Singh Verma. A month earlier, in May, the NDA had secured a majority at the Centre and Atal Bihari Vajpayee had become the Prime Minister. The Bill was presented in Parliament in August 2003 as the Delhi State Bill by the then Deputy Prime Minister, L.K. Advani, and referred to a standing committee. Though the BJP had lost the Delhi Assembly elections to the Congress in November 1998, political analysts said the party was confident of making a comeback in 2003 during the height of the India Shining campaign. Full statehood for Delhi was also a key election promise of the BJP for the Delhi Assembly polls that year.

INTRODUCTION

The 1999 General Election is an unnecessary imposition. It was thrust upon the country by a motley combination that put political negativism, narrow personal interests and greed for power far above the national good. The Government led by Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee lost the vote in the Lok Sabha on April 17 by just one and that too questionable vote. Despite promising a new government "in five minutes" and futilely attempting widespread defections, this negative coalition led by the Congress failed to come up with any alternative arrangement, forcing the dissolution of the Lok Sabha and fresh elections. A serving, performing Government was needlessly destabilised.

Legislative sovereignty

While preparing the 2003 Bill as well as the 1998 draft Bill, the BJP went by the opinion presented by the Home Ministry in a background note which stated that the existing constitution arrangement for Delhi, as outlined under Section 239 (AA and BB), enabled the Central government to exercise "overriding control." In other words, it said the Legislative Assembly of Delhi did not enjoy any legislative sovereignty even in respect of matters on which it was competent to make laws.

The BJP lost the Delhi Assembly elections to the Congress on December 4, 2003. The very next day, the report of the standing committee on the Delhi State Bill was presented to the Rajya Sabha. Interestingly, the committee was headed by Pranab Mukherjee, then a senior Congress leader.

In a prescient twist, the committee approved all the clauses under the Bill but expressed reservations over a clause which stated that the "President shall have executive power to give direction to the State of Delhi for good governance and proper development of the State" and that his directions will be binding on the State government.

"A view emerged in the committee that these powers were omnibus, sweeping and overriding in nature. It was felt that such powers of the President, which shall be binding on the government of State of Delhi, would impinge on the concept of Statehood proposed to be conferred on Delhi," the report of the committee said.

More pertinently, it observed that "such overriding and sweeping powers may be used by the Union government as a ploy to destabilise the elected government of Delhi." The Bill lapsed at the end of the Lok Sabha term.

Though Delhi got an elected legislative assembly — with a chief minister and a council of ministers — in 1993, the fight for full statehood still continues.

Law and order and land-related matters are still out of the purview of the government of the National Capital Territory of Delhi.

While the Union home ministry deals with law and order, the Delhi Development Authority (DDA) — which owns a major chunk of land in Delhi — is part of the Union Urban Development Ministry. The lieutenant governor, considered the Centre's representative in Delhi, is chairman of DDA. The police commissioner of Delhi too reports to the lieutenant governor.

"We have been demanding full statehood for Delhi. We passed the first resolution demanding complete statehood for Delhi and all related powers way back in 1956," said Vijay Kumar Malhotra, leader of the opposition and longest serving chief executive councillor of Delhi.

"Full statehood for Delhi has always been a part of our election manifesto," Malhotra added. "The Congress government in Delhi and in the Centre do not want it to happen."

Senior BJP leader in Delhi, Dr Harshwardhan, said development projects fail to take off just because land is not the Delhi government's subject.

"To set up new schools and hospitals, land is required. DDA used to take years to transfer a plot of land for a hospital. Even the follow-ups with the land owning agency used to have little impact," said Dr Harshwardhan, who served as health and education minister in the BJP government in Delhi from 1993 to 1998. "Without control over the police and land, Delhi cannot be called a state," said Dr Harshwardhan.

Not just the opposition BJP, some Congress MLAs in Delhi too have been vocal in their demand for full statehood for Delhi. According to senior Delhi government officials, the state assembly had passed resolutions demanding full statehood for Delhi seven times in the past few years.

The last one was in the winter session of Delhi assembly in 2010 when four-time Congress MLA Mukesh Sharma stoked a debate in the house after the LG returned the Delhi government's proposal to increase circle rates for reconsideration.

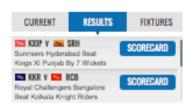
It also promised to bring police, DDA and other land-owning agencies under one roof to streamline governance.

Speaking on the occasion, Delhi BJP chief Harsh Vardhan, who is contesting from Chandni Chowk, said if BJP is voted to power at the Centre, it would work towards granting full statehood to Delhi.

"We have been demanding full statehood for last five decades. A bill in this regard was introduced in parliament when Atal Bihari Vajpayee was the Prime Minister, but it could not be made into a law after a report was not filed on time by the select committee. This election which is being fought to make Narendra Modi the prime minister of the country, the first thing we will demand from him is to give the status of full statehood to Delhi," said Vardhan.

NEW DELHI: Delhi BJP president Harsh Vardhan today said the first issue he will take up for the city with the new Prime Minister would be grant of full statehood to the national capital as it would help overcoming the problem of multiplicity of authorities.

"The first issue we will take up with Narendra Modiji as Prime Minister will be to grant full-statehood for Delhi," said Mr Vardhan, who was BJP's chief ministerial nominee in assembly election held last year.

Annexure C3: Sandeep Dikshit, former Delhi CM Sheila Dikshit's son expresses disappointment in Parliament over DDA not being under Delhi Government

SHRI SANDEEP DIKSHIT: Delhi has completed today 100 years of its being the Capital of the country. When the Master Plan of Delhi was prepared in 2007, there was total chaos in Delhi and on the order of the hon. Supreme Court,

ceiling and demolition was going on. The Government of India under whose jurisdiction the land and planning of Delhi lies had notified that Master Plan. The hon. Supreme Court took the entire Master Plan in its hand and said that unless it is cleared by the hon. Supreme Court, it would not be implemented. I urge the hon.

Minister to clarify the doubts as to whether the Master Plan of Delhi is presently in force or not and whether the Supreme Court is monitoring it or not and whether the Supreme Court is competent to prepare an urban Master Plan? The Supreme Court had constituted a Monitoring Committee at the time when ceiling and demolition was going on. There are 3-4 members in this Monitoring Committee who have created an atmosphere of terror in the entire State. I urge the Government to take up this matter with the hon. Supreme Court to scrap this Monitoring Committee and in case the Supreme Court is not in a position to implement the Master Plan, it should be handed over to the Government. The Government should consider granting the status of full Statehood to Delhi. There are around 1500 unauthorised certificate three years back. The Municipal Corporation passed the maps of merely 150 colonies. If the MCD passes the entire 1500 maps, the Government will authorize all those 1500 unauthorized colonies. The Irrigation Department of Uttar Pradesh is in possession of thousands of hectares of land in Delhi which is now required by Delhi to meet its growing requirements. I urge that the Uttar Pradesh Government use the land needed for irrigation purpose and rest of the land should be transferred to Delhi. The Central Government should take up this matter with the State Government of Uttar Pradesh to solve the issue. The DDA has not constructed a single house under the Jawaharlal Nehru Urban Renewal Mission for the EWS during the last 4-5 years. I fail to understand the logic behind keeping DDA under the control of the Central Government. I urge the Government to seriously ponder over giving more rights to the State Government of Delhi and its people.

Unveiling the election manifesto of the Congress for the upcoming Delhi Assembly elections in the presence of senior Congress leaders from Delhi, Ms. Dikshit urged the people "to choose a government which has raftar and anubhav (efficient and experienced)," when they go out to vote on December 4.
